

Kansas Law Enforcement Memorial Drawing Sale

The Kansas Law Enforcement Memorial, located at the Statehouse in Topeka Kansas, is in need of restoration. The Memorial has been dismantled due to a large renovation project on the Capitol grounds. It is eroding from exposure to the elements. It also needs to be expanded to create more room for adding additional names in the future. The Kansas Law Enforcement Memorial Drawing Sale will help raise money to be used for the restoration. The drawing for sale is a highly detailed black and white drawing of the Kansas Law Enforcement Memorial. The drawings are a limited edition of 2000, and are signed and numbered by the artist. They are 16 inches by 20 inches, and are suitable for framing. All of the proceeds from the sale of the drawings will be given to the Kansas Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation to be used for the restoration of the Memorial.

Lee Hammond is the artist who is drawing the Memorial. Lee has been a professional artist for more than 23 years. She has taken on many artistic goals, including police composite artwork. She has published 15 books, and has written and illustrated many short stories, how-to books, and children's books. She is also an authorized artist for NASCAR[®].
